Dr Anderson commenced in the role in August 2006 and completed more than 12 years' service on his retirement.

During his time, the Singapore campus of James Cook University:

- grew from 400 to almost 4000 students;
- became a fully-fledged part of James Cook University when the University bought out the then minority shareholder;
- was the first Australian university to achieve Singapore Quality Class Star;
- moved to a modern campus on Sims Road, with room to grow;
- was awarded for community service, with one such award being presented by Prime Minister Lee;
- achieved and sustained the highest quality rating EduTrust Star;
- widened the range of programs on offer, including offering Research Higher degrees, including the PhD, in Singapore;
- achieved recognition of JCU graduates with the Ministry of Education in China;
- and built a keen focus on alumni, demonstrated through the substantial growth of JCU Singapore's Alumni Association.

James Cook University featured in the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership between Singapore and Australia, signed by both nations' Prime Ministers in 2017, in which James Cook University was recognised with University status, the only Australian University operating in Singapore to enjoy this status.

Focus on the needs of our students

The learning intervention process of the Singapore campus of James Cook University is identified as an industry best practice. For example, implementation of learning intervention programme through Post Enrolment Language Assessment (PELA). This intervention is discipline-specific for each cohort of students. The pre and post assessment involved assessing English Language competency of students through short essay writing on

themes relevant to their discipline of study, and identifying those who needed support in academic skills. Feedback is obtained from the students who expressed that the learning support programme through customised workshops had helped improve their academic performance.

At the Singapore campus, JCU continues to provide innovative, collaborative learning environment and enhanced

learning analytics for students through the use of LearnJCU community and Blackboard Ultra Learning Management System (LMS). The transition to the cutting-edge BlackBoard Ultra has enhanced collaborative approaches to teaching and learning.

TEACHING EXCELLENCE

With the help of inbuilt analytics tools in the LMS, we are able to set target and measure assurance of learning for each course learning outcome (CLO) of its programmes through mapping of CLO to the marking rubric in the Blackboard LMS. For instance, with this technology- enabled system, we knew how students performed in each CLO against the set targets of 85% of students achieving Pass level (50-64% or above) and 20% achieving Distinction Level (75% or above) in 2018 for the Bachelor of Business and MBA Programs progressively. This aided us in monitoring and identifying areas where attention is needed in delivery and to take timely intervention actions.

JCU makes concious effort to seek accreditation/professional recognition for programs from relevant professional bodies in Australia and Singapore as appropriate. Depending on the program taken, there is professional recognition from the following organisations:

Such recognitions reflected the quality and enhanced the academic and professional standing of James Cook University's offered courses. Accreditations also brought benefits to its students and graduates in terms of career prospects and opportunities for progression and professional affiliations.

James Cook Universtiy in Singapore is also a member of AACSB (The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business) and is currently undergoing the process of accreditation.

James Cook University is an industry leader in practicum placement training for Doctor of Psychology (Clinical Psychology) & Master of Psychology (Clinical) programs. The effective and rigorous implementation of the practicum contributed to the highly favourable feedback by students and employers of these graduates for the two post-graduate degree programs.

JCU is committed to build opportunities by linking with relevant industries in Business. In 2018, 33 students (22%) out of 145 local students, excluding Psychology students, were placed for internship.

In 2018, James Cook University in Singapore introduced 2 new programs including the Master of Planning and Urban Design (Majoring in Disaster Resilience and Sustainable Tropical Urbanism) and Diploma in Higher Education (Majoring in Psychological Science).





My studies at ICU equipped me with the necessary research competencies and critical thinking that culminated in my thesis in the field of Cognitive Psychology. 

James Cook University in Singapore is actively growing its research presence in the fields of Psychology, IT, Business, Tourism, Environmental Marine Science and Aquaculture.

In 2018, a 5-year Strategic Research Plan was developed to help springboard research activities and to transition the campus to an increased research focus. Part of this strategy was to develop key partnerships with industry, NGO's and government agencies.

Accordingly, MoU's around research collaboration, exchanges, PhD and supervision were signed with the Agri-Food & Veterinary Authority of Singapore (AVA), Temasek Polytechnic, Chungnam National University, Korea, the Indian Chamber of Commerce, WorldFISH Malaysia, Singapore Centre of Aquaculture Innovation, and the University of Reading, Malaysia.

As part of improving volume and quality of research outputs, in 2018, ~S\$700,000 from external grants were awarded to James Cook University in Singapore and academics published 61 Scopus-recognised research articles. A Higher Degree by Research (Master of Philosophy and PhD) program was also offered for the first time at James Cook University in Singapore and commenced taking in research students.

In 2018, JCU started to implement a research infrastructure plan, including building of new physical resources e.g. science laboratories, an Aquaculture Research and Teaching Facility (completed in 2019). It also instigated a campus located Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee to approve and oversee any experiments involving legislated animals.

To promote research expertise of staff and engage the community several Panel Discussions were held on campus including discussions on Food Sustainability. This discussion showcased a diversity of opinions and issues related to food from a line of experts.

LAUNCH OF TFI







Given the importance of the conduct of high-quality and impactful research to the University, JCU has recently established a research institute in Singapore (the Tropical Futures Institute) that will leverage off the university's research capability and strengths and that creates substantiative value-add to the research ecosystem of Singapore and the ASEAN region.

The Tropical Futures Institute is the first research institute established by an Australian university in Singapore. The Institute was launched by The Honourable MP Karen Andrews during her first international visit as the Australian Minister for Industry, Science and Technology.

LAUNCH OF CITBA

James Cook University also launched its Centre for International Trade and Business in Asia (CITBA) on 30 November. CITBA is one of the foundation research centres within James Cook University's recently opened Tropical Futures Institute.

The Centre for International Trade and Business in Asia at James Cook University in Singapore brings together expertise in international trade, business, economic development, banking and finance, and sustainable urban planning, to successfully carry out research and consultancy projects throughout Asia that helps our stakeholders harness the opportunities that exist in the region.

The stopover of The Ocean Mapping Expedition at the Republic of Singapore Yacht Club, with the support of the Embassy of Switzerland in Singapore and James Cook University, offered opportunities to visit the boat and raise awareness about the other scientific programs of the expedition on noise and micro-plastic pollution of the oceans and coral bleaching due to global warming.
