This module will cover ethical issues relevant to professional practice as a psychologist. There will be specific reference to the Australian Psychological Society's Code of Ethics. There will also be regular reference to the Singapore Psychological Society's Code of Ethics. The Ethics section will focus largely on discussion of case studies and will require significant independent readings. In the second section, *Evidence in Psychological Assessment and Interventions*, students will consider the theoretical and empirical bases which underpin the evidence based approach to both psychological assessment approaches and treatment interventions.

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Trauma and Recovery

Trauma is an emotional response to a terrible event like an accident, violence or natural disaster. With daily incidents of violence, disasters, disease and death, interest in the effects of such events has increased. This module will explore topics examining effects of stress and trauma related to such events. It shall focus specifically on trauma related to health, violence and disasters and how psychological responses to these events affect the course of recovery. This subject has a strong emphasis on theoretical approaches to trauma and the applications of such theory to recovery. There will be 6 to 7 lectorials (depending on situation), of 3 hrs duration.
