

Checklist

The first month of university can be a particularly challenging period to navigate, so we have created the New Students Checklists to help guide you through.

Before Orientation Week

Read up on more about Singapore prior departing to Singapore.
Sign Letter of Offer, Student Contract, Advisory Note, and other required Admissions Forms. Make a note of the payment due dates and the various payment methods.
Ensure that all Offer Condition are met prior to course commencement (if applicable).
Attend the Reporting session with the Marketing and Admissions Office.
Attend the Verification of Document (Individual) session.
Complete the Student Satisfaction Survey.
Collect your JCUS Student ID Card.
Ensure you are <u>Digital Ready</u> for online and blended learning.
Complete your Student Pass Formalities (if applicable)
Set up your password on <u>JCU GetStarted</u> with your 8 digit Student ID. You can find your Student ID on the top right-hand corner of your Letter of Offer. Contact the <u>Admissions Office</u> for more enquiries.
Log into your <u>JCU Student Email</u> account and check messages regularly. This is your official communication channel with any staff from JCU.
Download the <u>JCU Calendars</u> to view important dates. Print them off or note the dates in your diary.





During Orientation Week

Attend the Course Welcome, DigiLearn Workshops, and JCU 101 during the Orientation Program.
Set up your password on <u>JCU GetStarted</u> with your 8 digit Student ID if you yet to do so. You can find your Student ID on the top right-hand corner of your Letter of Offer. Contact the <u>Admissions Office</u> for more enquiries.
Log on to <u>LearnJCU</u> to find out information from your lecturers about subjects, including textbook lists, assessment topics, deadlines, and grading information.
Learn more about LearnJCU through the LearnJCU Help Guides.
Find out about Student IT Essentials at JCU. Learn about JCU free software (Office 365), computers, printers, email, and wireless networks (eduroam).
Log on to eStudent for information related your enrolment and results.
Log on to StudentFirst for information related to your class schedules and attendance.
Make payments of first instalment course fees and International Student Registration fees (applicable for International Students). Refer to first trimester payment advice in the Student Contract. If you require an extension, submit the Request for Student Finance.
Register for AccessAbility Services if you have a disability, health condition or injury that might impact your studies.
Familiarise yourself with the different type of services at JCU – AccessAbility Services, Accommodation, Careers Services, Counselling, Student Affairs, JCU Student Council, Learning Advisors, Library, and Information and Communications Technology (ICT) team.
Explore the various options for transportation to and from JCU Singapore, including transport concessions to save money if you use public transport.

Academic Week 1

Read your Subject Outlines in <u>LearnJCU</u> . They contain vital info about how to succeed in your subject, lecturer/tutor contacts, consultation hours, academic expectations, and assessment information.
Check your personalised subject timetable in <u>eStudent</u> .
Make sure you keep track of important dates by downloading the JCU Calendars.
Visit the <u>Learning Centre</u> to discover online resources, free short courses and workshops to help develop your writing and referencing skills, learning techniques, time management, and more.
Collect your JCUS Student ID Card.
Check your <u>JCU Student Email</u> regularly. This is your official communication channel with any staff from JCU.

Academic Week 2

Bookmark the <u>JCU Current Students</u> page. This is your one-stop for all your portal log-ins, events, workshops, self-access resources, student support service, and much more.
Check due dates for your assignments at university via LearnJCU (Subject Outline). Don't forget to visit the <u>Learning Centre</u> for online <u>researching and writing guides</u> to help improve your skills and achieve the results you desire.
Explore the <u>Library</u> . Use the JCU <u>InfoSkills Toolkit</u> online to help you search for resources and references for your assignment.
Email your assigned Student Ambassador with any questions or concerns you may have.
Check out JCU Singapore Clubs and get involved.
